Improving Air Passenger Rights

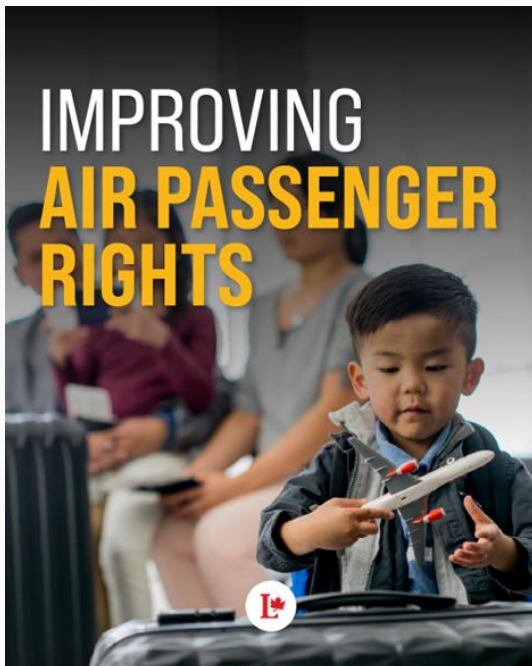
Canada's air sector is a cornerstone of our economy, connecting communities

and driving jobs, trade, tourism, and regional growth. That's why we are modernizing Air Passenger Protection Regulations by cutting through the complaints backlog with private sector expertise and clear, straightforward rules.

Today, nearly 100,000 Air Passenger Protection complaints are sitting in backlog at the Canadian Transportation Agency, and the number continues to grow. This is unacceptable and the government is taking action by engaging an outside dispute resolution group to help clear these complaints.
